## Racism

Racism has been defined, "Prejudice, discrimination, or antagonism directed against someone of a different race based on the belief that one's own race is superior." People of all nationalities and skin colors over thousands of years have exhibited racism.

Some might be surprised when they realize that Moses chose for himself a wife from Ethiopia. His own brother and sister were not happy with his decision. "Then Miriam and Aaron spoke against Moses because of the Ethiopian woman whom he had married; for he had married an Ethiopian woman" (Num. 12:1).

The proverbial sparks also flew in the first century between the Jews, Gentiles, and Samaritans. The racism or prejudice was certainly evident in the account with the Lord and the woman at the well.
